George Washington University

Maurice Joseph enters his 2nd season at the helm of the George Washington men's basketball program in 2017-18. Joseph served at the helm of a program that won 20 games in 2016-17. The youngest Head Coach in a Top 10 RPI conference, Joseph engineered a 10-8 conference record in the Atlantic 10 this season that included five consecutive wins to finish the regular season. An elite shooter in his playing days at Michigan State and Vermont, Joseph was instrumental in the Colonials being the most accurate three-point shooting team in the Atlantic 10 this season. Joseph, who played under Hall of Fame Coach Tom Izzo at Michigan State before transferring to Vermont where he served as a two-year captain, has been on the GW staff for six seasons, the last four of which saw the program advance to one NCAA Tournament, two NIT berths, and a CBI appearance, including the 2016 NIT Championship.



University of Pittsburgh

Kevin Sutton enters his 2nd season as an assistant coach at Pitt after spending 3 seasons at Georgetown. Sutton enters his 10th season as an assistant coach on the collegiate level to go along with a highly successful high school coaching resume. Sutton joined the Georgetown staff in 2013. He helped the team to a 55-44 record with a pair of postseason appearances during his tenure with the Hoyas. In his 2nd year with the program, Sutton saw Georgetown go 22-11 overall and reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Sutton arrived at Georgetown following 2 seasons as an assistant at George Washington. He also had a pair of 2-yr stints as an assistant at both JMU and ODU. Sutton also coached at 5 nationally-ranked high school- amassing a 489-102 record and winning 2 national championships. In 1998, he was the associate head coach on the USA Today Super 25 National Championship team and in 2007, he was the head coach of the Montverde Academy National Championship team. At Montverde, Sutton coached 7 nationally ranked teams and compiled a 186-33 record, while turning out 55 D I scholarship athletes and 3 All-America selections.



Irish National Team

Pete Strickland is the head coach for the Irish senior men's national team. Strickland will coach in the FIBA Small Nations European Championships in 2018. The Rockville native is no stranger to the Irish basketball scene, having played with Neptune from 1980-1982, where he helped the Cork side to an undefeated regular season and Top Four title and became player/coach at the age of just 23. The American now boasts over 31 years of coaching experience across the professional, collegiate and high school ranks, including stints at VMI, ODU, University of Dayton, Coastal Carolina, NC State and GWU. Strickland has 23 years of Division I coaching experience, including 7 years as a head coach at Coastal Carolina from 1999-05. He earned Big South Coach of the Year honors in 1999-00 and left CCU with the second-most career victories in school history. While at Coastal Carolina, Strickland helped produce three All-Americans. One of Strickland's players was the Big South Player of the Year 3 times in his last 5 years at Coastal, while 3 players made the All-Rookie Team, and 2 were named Rookie of the Year.



Mt. St. Mary's University

Jamion Christian has led the Mount back to the top of the NEC. After taking the Mount to the NEC title game in his 1st season, Christian guided the Mount to the NEC title & a berth in the NCAA Tournament in 2014 & in 2017 including an NCAA tournament win over the University of New Orleans. He has guided the Mount to a winning record in NEC play each season with a 55-33 NEC record. Christian refers to his team's style of play as Mayhem, which features a pressing defense and an offense reliant on the three-point shot. Christian was an assistant coach at VCU under Shaka Smart in 2011-12. VCU won the CAA Tournament title and finished with a school-record 29 wins this year. Prior to his time at VCU, he spent three years at William & Mary. The Tribe made their 2nd postseason appearance in school history in 2010 and recorded the 3rd most wins in school history with 22.



Hood College

Chad Dickman came to Hood after spending 9 years at Wheeling Jesuit University as the associate head coach of the men's basketball team and was the Cardinals compliance officer from 2006-13. He has earned a 62-45 record over 4 years at Hood. While at WJU, he helped the men's basketball program to three NCAA appearances, the first in school history. The local product played high school basketball for his father at Thomas Johnson High School. While there, he helped the Patriots win the 1997 State Championship and led the team to the 1998 State Final Four, earning all-state honors his senior year. Dickman continued his playing career at St. Vincent from 1998-2002, scoring 1,279 points and led the Bearcats to the NAIA Tournament twice, reaching the Elite 8 in 2002.



UMBC

Ryan Odom was the recipient of the 2017 Joe B. Hall Award, which is presented annually to the top 1st-year coach in DI. After finishing 7-25 last season, Odom mentor led UMBC (21-13) to its 1st winning season since 2007-08. The 21 wins are the 2nd most in school history and UMBC finished the year as the nation's 3rd-most improved team. Odom served as head men's basketball coach at Lenoir-Rhyne (N.C.) University for the 2015-16 season. The Bears (21-10) advanced to the NCAA DII Regional Finals for the 1st time in school history & won 20 games in a season for the 1st time in 8 years. Lenoir-Rhyne improved by 10.5 games. Prior to earning the position at Lenoir-Rhyne, Odom coached at UNC Charlotte, 2010-15. The 49ers earned a bid to the NIT in 2013. In May of 2014, the Durham, N.C. native was elevated to associate head coach and on January 6, 2015, Odom was named interim head coach at Charlotte for the remainder of the season.
